Preparing for Camp

What to Bring:

- Three days' worth of clothes and pyjamas (Including old pair of clothes and shoes that you don't mind destroying)
- ₩ Enclosed shoes & a pair of thongs
- ДДД Towel
- ДДД Backpack
- ДДД Hat
- ₩ Water bottle
- ₩ Insect repellent & sunscreen
- AM Bible, notepad & pens
- Medication (If applicable) brought in a ziplock bag with name and details of when it needs to be taken
- Щ Toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, shampoo, conditioner & soap

What NOT to Bring:

- W Valuables (Any valuables brought will be the responsibility of the camper that brings them)
- Money is not needed on camp but there is a cafe out the front of the GCRC that is open for coffees and treats

- Pranks will not be tolerated. Anything brought for pranks will be confiscated and destroyed.





Schedule Details

Runsheet

Below is a schedule for the campers to look at. This will be put up in every cabin, along with maps, tribe and connect lists to help kids know what to wear, bring and prepare for. Our leaders will also remind kids and give them enough notice before services/ events/ tribes so that they can get ready.

Our Services

C3 Currumbin will be hosting our services in their auditorium! Their church is about a 15-minute drive from our camp site. The same bus line that is driving us to and from camp will pick us up and drop us off for our services. The bus will have all leaders available on it with a car following.

Leaders

Tribes and Connect Leaders will also be put in cabins so that each camper knows who is looking after them. Your camper is with the same over 18 leaders for each cabin and connect group. These leaders will already be well known to the campers from Friday night Youth. Our leaders all have a list of campers to look out for and gather for mealtimes, connect, showers, hydration, services and tribes.

Cabin Allocation

We do our best to allocate campers to cabins with their friends. This is done as the very last task, once we have the final registrations. We would appreciate your suggestions but please know that we can't promise all suggestions given. We are aware that some cabins will have people from other locations or churches and we ask that our campers make an effort to be inclusive.

Camp Rules

Site Camp Rules

- Curfew is 10pm every night (On Site Security walking grounds after hours. Campgrounds are fully gated and coded with a master code)
- No passing on of your room codes (All rooms have separate codes that only campers in that room have)
- Separate boys and girls cabins (Campers are not permitted outside of their allocated areas)
- ₩ No smoking, vaping or drinking alcohol onsite
- No pressing of emergency buttons without an emergency (\$2000 fine associated)

Royal Youth Rules

- 1. We do everything together
 - Free time is a choice of two options: Either Talle creek or campgrounds

 - AM Stay with the group at all times
- 2. We respect all leaders, GCRC staff & fellow campers
- No entering other cabins (without permission) or taking/touching of another camper's belongings
- Swearing, arguing with leaders or staff & physical contact of any kind will not be tolerated
- ₩ No bullying, gossiping or belittling will be tolerated
- Pranking of any kind will not be tolerated and may result in the camper being sent home.

Pranking Defined: Anything that can hurt (physically or emotionally) someone, destroy something or potentially harm anyone. We will not permit any practical jokes or even planning of jokes. This may result in the camper being sent home.





Behaviour

A high-quality program can only take place in an orderly, mutually respectful, caring environment. Young people's guidance is a process where campers take increasing responsibility for their own actions. At Royal Youth, we take the emotional, spiritual, mental and physical wellbeing and safety of our young people seriously. Therefore, we work very hard at creating a safe and fun environment. Along with our efforts, we need the campers to help us by following some simple rules. Not abiding by our camp rules may result in the camper being sent home.

All incidents will be handled on a 3-incident system, except hitting, fighting, and inappropriately touching another camper. (This will be an immediate send home)

Our Royal Yth leaders will have a behaviour record in place to log any misbehaviour according to severity (using form and auto log that will be reviewed daily)

All other incidents will be handled as follows:

1st Incident= Verbal warning from youth leader

2nd Incident= Parent contact from senior core team

3rd Incident= Camper will be sent home

Royal Yth and GCRC staff and management reserve the right to dismiss a camper from the days' activities if their behaviour is disruptive to the camp and/or compromises the safety of themselves, other campers and/or leaders and staff. Campers' who are sent home from camp will not qualify for a refund. By signing, I agree to partner with Royal Yth in making Open Heaven: Glory 2025 positive and safe for all campers, families, staff and leaders involved.

What happens if a camper is sent home?

The camper's parents will be notified and asked to pick up the camper from the campsite within four hours of receiving the call. Whilst awaiting collection, the camper may be asked to wait in their room or in an area away from the other campers.

By sending your child/ children to camp, you agree that in the unfortunate event of a camper being sent home, you will be responsible for the collection of your child.





Camp Safety

Blue Cards & CYPP Training

All leaders attending will hold a current blue card and undergo Safe Churches training before attending camp. This training is mandatory to lead on youth camp. This training teaches our youth leaders about disclosures of harm, reporting incidences and recognising situations that need attention.

First Aid & CPR Trained Officers

GCRC is a government facility that has a sick bay and fully trained first aid staff. However, within our team we also have first aid officers. These people include Renee Parker, Jeremy Cake, Helen Mirams & Jacob Cox.

Swimming

- GCRC is located on the corner of Palm Beach & Tallebudgera Creek. The creek is a lifeguard patrolled area and the campers will also be required to take a leader with them. Our ratio on camp is one leader to 11 campers so this will be our gauge as we count how many kids are wanting to go.
- The patrolled beach is a bit of a walk from camp so we will just be using the sand area of palm beach for Tribal Warfare but won't be swimming in the ocean.
- GCRC has a pool available for use when a lifeguard is present as well, again, campers need to take a leader with them.

Hydration & Sunscreen

We will allocate 2 leaders each day to ensure water is near and consumed and sunscreen is applied and reapplied. Please note, if your child requires sensitive sunscreen, you will have to provide this for them.





Medication and Food Allergies

Medication

All medication will be monitored by a senior leader while on camp and must be checked in prior to getting on the bus for camp. We do not permit the kids to bring or take any medication that is not checked in.

Before Camp

Make sure your rego reflects the medication you need. Please specify when and dosage required each day. Bring your medication in a zip lock bag, clearly labelled with your name and the above details.

During Camp

Leaders of those with daily medication will be reminded on each day to get the camper to take their medication. (It will also be the campers responsibility to take action of these reminders and bring to the attention of their leader if they're unwell.)

After Camp

When parents come to collect campers on the 13th of January, the medication will be handed back to the camper and their parents. (It is the responsibility of the camper to collect this. Any medication left with the youth team without communication, will be destroyed.)

Food Allergies

We can cater for food allergies and intolerances over camp. Onsite catering will provide all meals including breakfast, snack, lunch, snack, dinner & supper. Action plans will need to be clear and provided at the time of registration. A menu will be provided closer to the start of camp.





Fundraising

We would LOVE our youth to be a part of earning their camp rego! There are three ways that we would love for our youth to be involved:

- 1. The camper's own fundraising
 Through chores and yard work Bring your earnings to the info
 desk on Sunday morning and we will allocate it to your
 registration,
- 2. Weekly camp payments
 Paid weekly through Brushfire or cash at the info desk on a
 Sunday morning. You're able to select how much you want to pay
 each transaction by selecting "Make A Payment" on your
 registration confirmation email.
- 3. Cadbury fundraising chocolate boxes
- Order your box by Sunday 1st of September and then collect your box in the cafe after each service on Sunday 8th of September.
- This will be limited to one box per camper and then once that box is sold, we can put in another order for another box.
- It will be the responsibility of the camper to sell the chocolates and return the cost and profit of the box. (\$40.00 cost & additional \$20 profit)
- Give this money to Louise Van Der Heijde or Jeremy Cake on a Sunday or a Friday night at youth.

- We don't recommend that children sell the products if they are involved, please ensure an adult is always with them


Other useful information
